FINAL ORDER

This matter came before the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (the Commission) at a public meeting on May 8, 2008, in Naples, Florida. It was alleged by Administrative Complaint that the Respondent had violated specified sections of Chapter 943, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 11B-27, Florida Administrative Code. Subsequently, the parties entered into a Stipulation and Settlement Agreement, which was presented to the Commission for its consideration in accordance with §§120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes. The Commission, having read and considered the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement, having reviewed other documents in the case file, and being otherwise fully advised, finds that:

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties to this case.
2. The entry of this Final Order and the Respondent's full compliance

with the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement will conclude the administrative proceedings in the above-styled case.

The Respondent having agreed to the terms set forth above and having entered into a Stipulation and Settlement Agreement that memorializes those terms, it is therefore ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

1. The above-referenced Stipulation and Settlement Agreement is approved, adopted and incorporated herein by reference.
2. The Respondent will adhere to and abide by all the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement.
3. This Final Order will become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Department of Law Enforcement.

SECOND STIPULATION AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

COMES NOW, the Petitioner, Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, by and through the undersigned Assistant General Counsel, the Respondent, Robert E. Chapman, and enter into the following Stipulation and Settlement Agreement pursuant to Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes, as the final resolution of this cause, subject to ratification and adoption by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission. The Terms of this agreement are as follows:

1. The Respondent maintains his denial of the charges set forth in the Administrative Complaint and does not, by entry into this Stipulation and Settlement Agreement, admit the allegations of misconduct set forth in the Administrative Complaint filed herein, but agrees to the terms of this agreement in order to finally dispose of this case.
2. The Respondent agrees as a condition of settlement of this cause to a thirty-day prospective suspension of certifications.
3. The Respondent agrees to a one-year period of probation. The one-year period of probation shall commence fifteen days after the entry of the Final Order and continue for one

year thereafter. The staff of the Criminal Justice Professionalism Program, Florida Department of Law Enforcement, shall monitor the probation.


4. As a condition of probation, the Respondent shall provide staff with proof of successful completion of Commission-approved ethics course prior to the end of the probationary period.
5. As a further condition of probation, the Respondent shall not violate any provision of Section 943.13, Florida Statutes, or Chapter 11B-27, Florida Administrative Code.
6. The Respondent shall, during the term of probation, advise the staff, in writing, of any change of address, telephone number and/or employment.
7. The undersigned Assistant General Counsel or assignee agrees to recommend that the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission adopt this Stipulation and Settlement Agreement as the final disposition of this matter.
8. Both parties understand that this proposed settlement is not final until the Commission has approved and adopted it as the final disposition of this case. The parties further understand that if the Commission does not approve and adopt this agreement, the case can then proceed to formal hearing as originally requested by the Respondent, unless the parties agree otherwise.
